

Autumn Birding Bingo (Advanced)

Step outside this fall (mid-September through the end of November) to enjoy the activities of the last breeding birds before they migrate south, migrating birds passing through the area, birds arriving in Indiana for the winter, and our stalwart resident species. See how many boxes you can cross off to make B-I-N-G-O, either horizontally, vertically, or diagonally -- or if you are feeling very inspired, go for a blackout Bingo!

Spot a duck with some white feathers	Spot a Turkey Vulture or Black-Headed Vulture	Go birding at Goose Pond	Spot a vireo (such as a White-Eyed Vireo)	Hear the sound of migrating Sandhill Cranes
Go birding at Yellowwood State Forest	Spot a warbler with yellow feathers	Listen at dusk for calling owls (such as Barred Owls)	Spot a flock of migrating Canada Geese	Hear a drumming woodpecker
Spot a warbler with black and white feathers	Spot a foraging shorebird (such as a Pectoral Sandpiper or Wilson's Snipe)	Free Space!	Spot a thrush (such as a Swainson's Thrush)	Spot a kinglet (such as a Ruby-Crowned Kinglet)
Spot a Common Nighthawk hunting in the evening	Create an eBird checklist to keep track of your bird sightings	Spot a duck with red or rusty-colored feathers	Spot a merganser (such as a Hooded Merganser)	Spot a Ruby-Throated Hummingbird
Spot a Dark-eyed Junco	Spot a Bald Eagle	Spot a Brown Creeper (hint: look on tree trunks!)	Spot a wren (such as a Winter Wren or house wren)	Go birding at Lake Monroe
